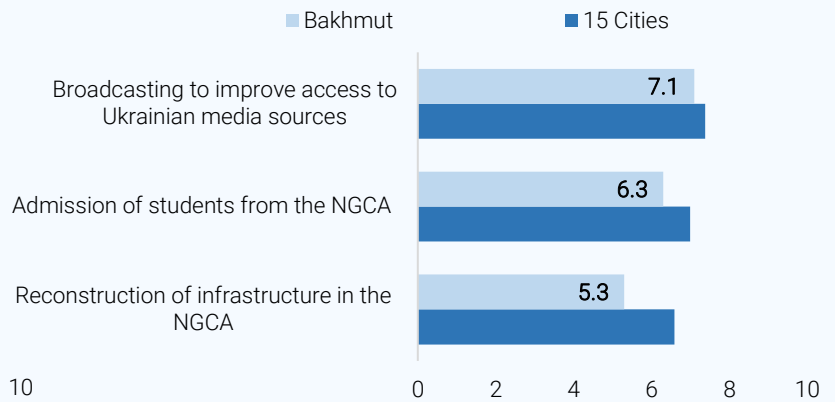
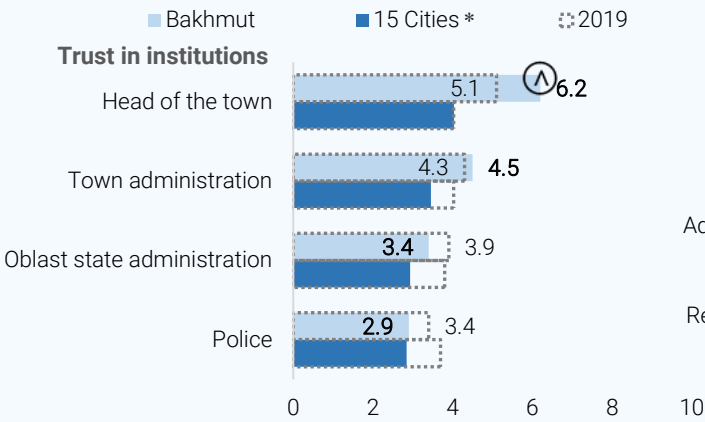

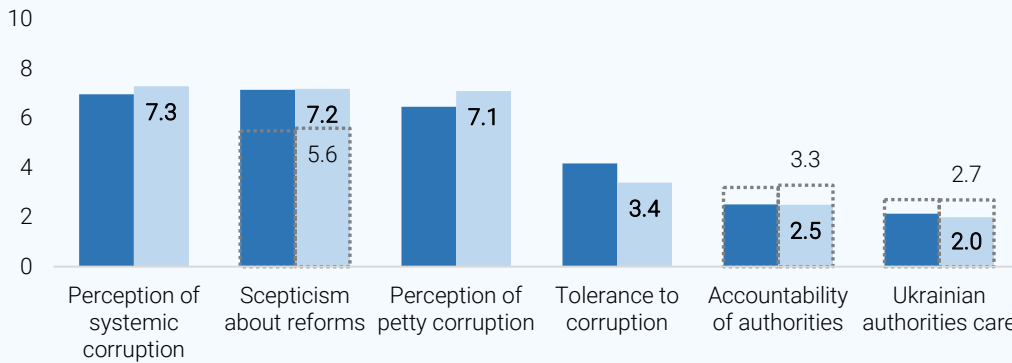
GOOD GOVERNANCE

Support for Efforts for NGCA Reintegration



Trust in the head of town increased significantly compared to 2019 with 73% trusting Bakhmut's head of town.

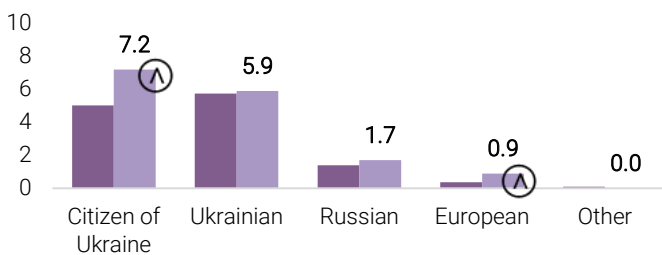
Support for efforts for NGCA reintegration is lower among citizens in Bakhmut compared to the other 14 cities.



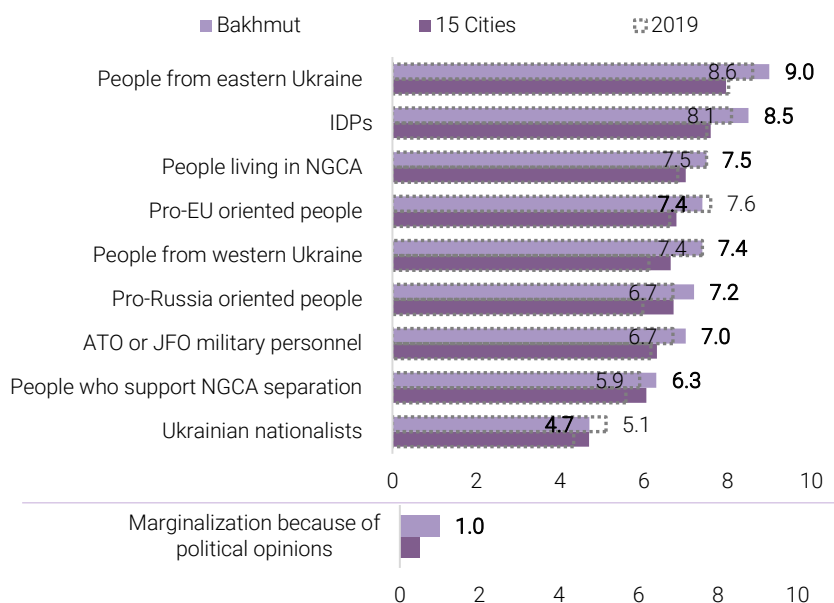
Facilitate public meetings (e.g., online civic assemblies with authorities and citizen representatives) to discuss and respond to concerns to improve sense of care. The mayor, as the most trusted institutional representative, could be an exemplar to promote transparency and accountability, informing people about reforms, anti-corruption initiatives, and service delivery investments

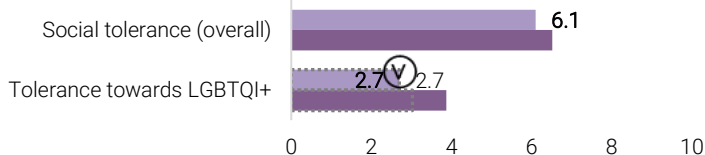

Social Tolerance



In 2021, Bakhmut won the UNICEF "Cities Inspire Award" for establishing support systems for children with disabilities. Capitalize on this momentum to identify vulnerable groups and promote programmes for their empowerment. One of those groups is the LGBTQI+ community. Build empathy and tolerance through promotion of equality and diversity and dialogue around sexuality (e.g., public broadcasting of documentaries and discussion afterwards).

23% of citizens in Bakhmut feel marginalized because of their or their family's political opinion.

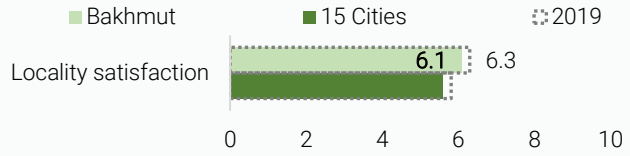
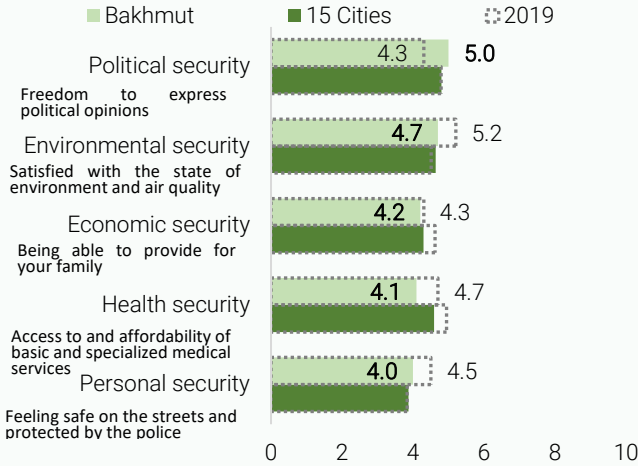

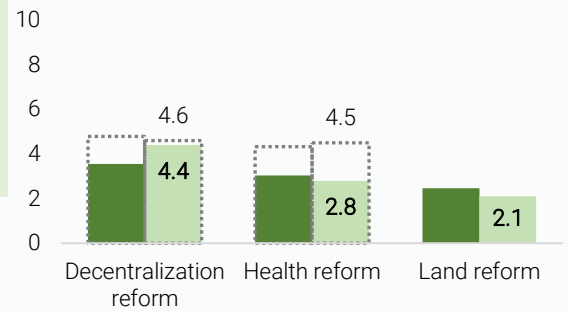

Safety & Security



Support for health reform decreased drastically. Organise information and dialogue campaigns to understand citizens' scepticism and anxieties about the reform, and better communicate progress and dividends.

Support for reforms



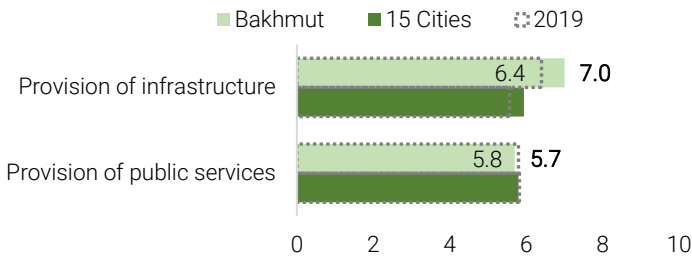
78% of citizens in Bakhmut believe the health reform will reduce the quality of medical services.

69% of citizens in Bakhmut do not feel confident the police can protect them from violence and 66% feels unsafe walking alone in the street at night.

Establish online early- warning systems in collaboration with the district police where people can report suspicious activities. This could also improve the responsiveness of the police force and their visibility. Organize public meetings with local authorities and police to discuss causes of insecurity to design tailored interventions responding to citizens' fears.

Bakhmut was among the first cities to create amalgamated community. Although low, citizens of Bakhmut support the decentralization reform more compared to other 14 cities.

Provision of Services

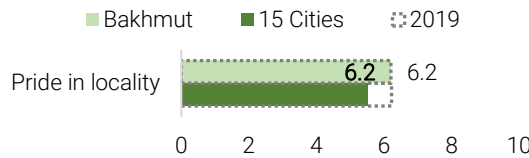


Out of all 15 cities, citizens in Bakhmut are the most satisfied with the quality of roads (6.9 vs. 5.3).

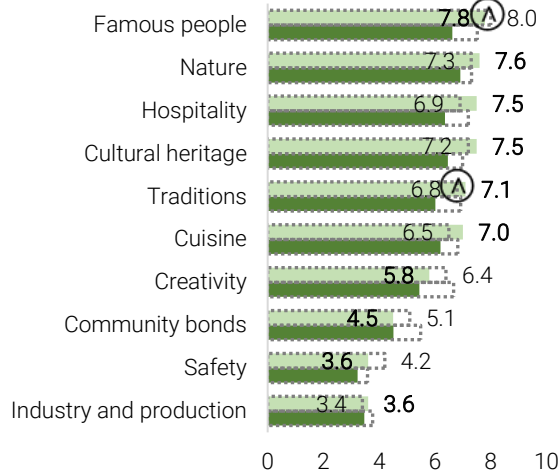
75% of citizens in Bakhmut believe justice services are inefficient.

Pride in your locality

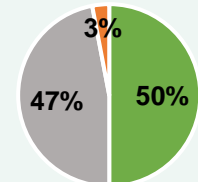
When you think about your locality, to what extent are you proud of the following?

Develop networks of citizens focusing on programmes supporting vulnerable groups with specific needs. Link people from different socio-demographic groups together to help with daily needs to foster community cohesion (e.g., 'buddy' system matching IDP-local or young-elderly person).
