



## **MELITOPOL 2021, CITY PROFILE**




#### **GOOD GOVERNANCE**



Scepticism towards reforms increased significantly but remains lower than the average of the 15 cities (7.2). Citizens in Melitopol also perceive less corruption but also became more tolerant to corruption compared to 2019.



Findings suggest that the implementation of police and security reforms are benefits creating and improving confidence in the police and sense of safety. Good practices and lessons could be learned from Melitopol and replicated in other cities. Facilitate civic participation mechanisms for inclusive decision-making and dialogue between Melitopol's head of town, town administration and citizens to improve accountability of authorities and their responsiveness to citizens' needs.





