




Mykolaiv oblast mirrors the overall national trend in terms of the most trusted institutions; it demonstrates high confidence in the Ukrainian army, the State Emergency Service and the President. They are followed by the NGOs and local authorities. Interestingly, trust towards the oblast state/military administration is 15% higher than the national average and the highest across Ukraine. In line with the nationwide data, the least trusted institutions are the courts, the Parliament, the Prosecutor General's office and the Cabinet of Ministers. The picture at the oblast level is nearly identical to the national trend on the authorities care and the perceived local corruption indicators.

Social Tolerance



Similar to the nationwide picture, donating money, helping those in need and volunteering to help the Ukrainian army are the three most popular forms of civic resistance to Russia's full-scale aggression against Ukraine. Mykolaiv oblast residents follow the national trend also on social tolerance indicators. Highest levels of tolerance are demonstrated for Ukrainian-speaking Ukrainians, Russian-speaking Ukrainians and people from other regions of Ukraine. Moreover, social tolerance towards drug addicts and the LGBTQI+ community remains relatively low.

This oblast profile is based on a representative sample of 299 respondents who were living in Mykolaiv oblast at the time of surveying. The full sample data is based on a representative sample of 4995 respondents from 24 oblasts in Ukraine. Sampling Method: CATI. Data was collected from June to August 2023. Margin of error on the national level: ~+/-1.4%. Margin of error on the oblast level: ~+/-5.7%

▽ More than 10% lower than the full sample








The level of economic security in Mykolaiv oblast remains average and nearly identical to the nationwide figures. The residents, however, report somewhat lower levels of health security across all three measured indicators. Mykolaiv oblast residents also report somewhat lower level of personal safety, 41%, compared to the national average, 49%.

Basic Needs Assessment



The overall evaluation of the availability of necessities in Mykolaiv oblast tends to be rather high and in line with the nationwide picture. Still, accessibility to three out of four most lacking necessities - bomb shelters, childcare and cultural centres – is assessed to be visibly lower than the full sample (10%, 13% and 14%, respectively).

Information consumption about political affairs



Like on the national level, friends and family remain the most important source of information on political affairs for Mykolaiv oblast residents, followed by social media, news websites and daily news on television. Newspapers, news on radio and political talk shows continue to be the least popular means for information consumption on political affairs.

Displacement

Compared to the national figures, Mykolaiv oblast holds somewhat lower share of stayers and similar proportions of IDPs and returnees.
